Commissioner Meeting

May 5, 2020

Teleconference as per Governor Ricketts Executive Order No. 20-03

The Deuel County Commissioners met via teleconference on the above date with the following officials participating: Chairperson Steven Fischer, Commissioner William Klingman, Commissioner Jean Timm, County Attorney Jonathon Stellar and County Clerk Polly Olson. The meeting was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

The agenda was approved upon motion of Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm . Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye. Motion was made by Commissioner Timm, second of Commissioner Klingman, to approve the regular minutes of the April 7 ,2020 meeting. Fischer, aye, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye.

County Clerk Polly Olson presented a report of fees collected in her office for the month of April in the amount of \$2,155.37. This report was reviewed and approved for filing.

There was no action for the Board of Equalization.

The propane contract was discussed. There was a balance left over of 1,800 gallons from the contract last year. It was moved by Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm, to approve a propane contract with Frenchman Valley Coop for 5,200 gallons at 1.30 per gallon. Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye. County Highway Supt. Tony Armer reported that there needed to be maintenance on CR 6 between CR 153 and CR 157. He felt it could be handled by the county and will include a culvert. The county will fix this portion of the driveway.

Upon motion of Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm, a utility permit for Wheat Belt Public Power was approved. Fischer, aye, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye.

Judd Allen, Doug Leafgreen and Dick Maggert, representing the NACO group presented a proposal for Blue Cross Blue Shield health insurance for the county employees. The policy includes a one year 10% fee that will be reduced July 1, 2021. Different plans were compared and it was reiterated that the county wanted a composite rate to be consistent for budgetary purposes and fairness to all employees. The deductible buy-back can still be offered. Upon motion Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm, the County will enter into the NACO group plan Blue Cross Blue Shield NE-NACO unlimited PPO with an individual \$2,500.00 deductible. The County will buy-back \$2,000.00, thus the employee will pay \$500.00 of their own deductible. This includes a \$30.00 co-pay. Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye. The NACO representatives will come to present employee meetings closer to the time needed for open enrollment.

The Commissioners discussed tentative plans to re-open May 19. County Attorney Jonathon Stellar was instructed to draft a plan for review. Each office was encouraged to be in preparation by obtaining the necessary supplies.

Motion was made by commissioner Timm, second of Commissioner Klingman to approve claims in the amount of \$102,415.43 (Payroll \$30,450.08 and claims \$71,965.35). Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye.
