



Deuel County Board Minutes



Deuel County Commissioner Meeting

July 7, 2020

The Deuel County Commissioners met on the above date with the following officials present: Chairperson Steve Fischer, Commissioner William Klingman, Commissioner Jean Timm, County Attorney Jonathon Stellar and County Clerk Polly Olson. The meeting, notice of which was published in the Chappell Register as according to law, was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silence. Reference was made to open meeting laws, posted at the entrance of the room. The agenda was approved upon motion of Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm. Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye. The minutes of the June 23, 2020 meeting was approved upon motion of Commissioner Timm, second of Commissioner Klingman. Fischer, aye, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye.

County Clerk Polly Olson presented a report of fees collected in the office for the month of June 2020, in the amount of \$4,125.56. This report was reviewed and accepted for filing.

Motion was made by Commissioner Fischer, second of Commissioner Klingman, to enter into the Board of Equalization to hear Tax List Corrections at 8:32 a.m. Timm, aye, Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye.

Motion was made by Commissioner Fischer, second of Commissioner Klingman to resume the regular meeting at 8:34 a.m. Timm, aye, Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye.

Christy Warner of Kimball County Transit Services met with the board to report on the activities of the minibus service formerly known as the Deuel County Minibus. She reported that the revenue from fares had greatly increased, from less than \$1,000.00 last year to \$12,685.00. She reported that revenue received from Medicare was \$13,792.00. The CARES act meals have been covered for the last three months. She will be hiring another driver and plans to replace an older bus are in the works.

A bid from Baker and Associates was reviewed for the engineering and costs associated for services rendered to repair the Day Road north of Big Springs. It was moved by Fischer, second of Klingman, to accept a bid from Baker and Associates which is 10 percent of the construction costs. Timm, aye, Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye. It is the intent to have the project completed this year. Garden County will also contract with them to complete the one mile of road located in their county. Each county will pay their own costs, including the engineering. Deuel will be billed 90% and Garden 10%. County Highway Supt. Tony Armer reported that 2 contractors have indicated interest in bidding for the project. Brad Slaughter of Piper Sandler answered questions pertaining to the highway allocation bond and the rates that will be available. The interest rate will be 1.9 to 2%. The closing can take place late August. The first payment will be due in September of 2021. Motion was made by Commissioner Timm, second of Commissioner Klingman to move forward with the 15 year amortization, the county will not opt to defer payments. Fischer, aye, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye. Supt. Armer reported that the project south of Big Springs should be completed this coming Thursday.

Maintenance contractor Jim Reichman reported on the damage to the annex roof. He presented a bid from Mitchell Spray Foam Insulation in the amount of \$4,500.00 to repair hail damage to the two roofs and the parapet owned by the county. The adjoining wall (parapet) damage is estimated at \$900.00, which was damaged when the roof blew off the adjoining building. Also present were Richard and Betty O'Bannon, owners of the adjoining building. The County clerk is instructed to submit the estimate to NIRMA, the county insurer. Contractor Reichman will secure the wall on the county property and the O'Bannons can start the demolition of their property.

Extension Educator Laura Narjes reported on the activities planned for the 4-H during the Deuel County fair. Hand sanitizing stations as well as hand sanitizer will be placed throughout. Six feet distancing will be observed. Plans have been submitted and approved by the Panhandle Public Health District. Fairboard member Leslie Snell was also present



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to answer questions regarding the activities during the fair. It will be 4-H and their families only. No open exhibits. There will be fireworks and the public will be required to stay in or near vehicles to observe them.

Deuel County Sheriff Scott DeCoste presented a report of fees collected for the month of June, in the amount of \$87.45. This report was reviewed and accepted for filing.

Warrants in the amount of \$121,867.00, were approved upon motion of Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Fischer, (Payroll \$35,166.47, Claims \$86,700.53), Klingman, aye. Timm, aye, Fischer, aye.
